## Our Priorities

Chesterfield Community Safety Partnership produces a three year Community Safety plan. This plan sets out how the members of the Partnership intend to work together to reduce crime, disorder, substance misuse and fear of crime in Chesterfield for a three-year rolling period. To help in producing the plan a strategic assessment has been carried out. It includes an analysis of the level and patterns of crime and disorder, analysis of any changes that have taken place over the past three years and reflects the views expressed by our community on what should be prioritised. The assessment has been used to help Chesterfield Community Safety Partnership develop its 2008 - 2011 plan, identifying the priorities and where Partnership members can work together to achieve positive results.

The priorities for the 2008 - 2011 plan are Anti-social behaviour (including hate crime), Violent Crime (including domestic abuse) and Serious Acquisitive Crime. Key objectives for each priority identified by the strategic assessment and community consultation are detailed opposite.
