...deal with anti-social behaviour

Is anti-social behaviour affecting your quality of life?

Would you like help to deal with things like vandalism, graffiti and noise?

If you feel unable to change things or afraid of what might happen if you try, Victim Support Derbyshire is here to help.

Our trained volunteers are on hand to support, guide and help you make decisions about how you may like to deal with behaviour which may cause you harassment, alarm or distress.

We do this by providing confidential, emotional and practical support to victims and witnesses of anti-social behaviour. Our services are free, confidential and independent of the police and courts.

We're available to everyone in every situation, even if an incident has not been reported and regardless of when it happened.

If you're a victim or witness of anti-social behaviour we can:

- Help you understand how the police and court process works.
- Talk to other organisations such as the police on your behalf.
- Help you understand all the information about compensation and insurance matters.
- Guide you to other people who can also help.
- Give you information about how to report anti-social behaviour.

If you're required to go to court we can:

- Help you fully understand how the courts work.
- Offer you a pre-trial visit so you can be familiar with the court layout before you go.
- Support you all the way through the hearing and even accompany you into the court room.
- Offer you practical support throughout the hearing such as help filling out paperwork.
- Talk over the case with you when it has ended and offer further guidance and emotional support.

This kind of behaviour can cause distress and alarm to people who are suffering from it. As well as offering support to victims and witnesses we need more volunteers to take on this specialised work.
