HUB MODEL

Directed Training and Community
Engagement Raises awareness not only to
empower society and other key stakeholders
to identify victims of slavery and aid in
subsequent rescue but to educate and
inform potential victims and vulnerable
communities of their legal rights, so that
they are galvanized and are less likely to be
targeted by exploiters and traffickers.

HUB MODEL

Targeted outreach and victim identification shines a light on those already trapped in slavery or left destitute and aids both direct and assisted rescue in collaboration with statutory and non statutory agencies. Initial assessment and support builds knowledge of the NRM and other pathways to remediation, builds survivor resilience and assists first responders in affecting meaningful intervention.

IMSA TEAM

Independent advocacy provides Socio-legal support, tailored to the individual needs of the survivor, and a single and consistent point of trust, ensuring survivors can access rights and overcome barriers; building sustainable independence and mitigating the risk of re-trafficking. As well as ensuring survivor's voices are heard and empower engagement with criminal and civil justice processes.



Directed Training

We train to spot the signs of Modern Slavery & how to respond if identifying Human Trafficking



Many referrals to our team come from those we have trained



Our Community Engagement

We are available to offer assistance and advice in any situations where there may be victims of human trafficking and/or modern slavery

We can meet directly with victims to offer independent guidance on their situation, and if necessary, explain their options including entering the NRM or alternatives pathways

We offer advice and guidance to other professionals supporting victims with personal identification matters and expert advocacy.

Our Community Engagement

We offer survivors the option to disclose to independent organisations, and facilitate their engagement with the police should they choose to report

We use our cultural and language skills during a trauma-informed approach to build trust and engagement over time

Our Independent Modern Slavery Advocates are always close by for Socio-legal support and work with our legal team form our Head Office.
