Name of Service / Project	Choices (Making Positive Choices)
Description	Choices is a programme that aims to support 11-19 year olds who are at risk of perpetrating abuse or displaying controlling behaviour in their relationships. This also aims to address issues around Child and Adolescent to Parent Violence and Abuse (CAPVA) which we are increasingly seeing within our referrals. The specific aims of the project: • To address and reduce these abusive tendencies at the earliest possible stage • To help these children and young people to make positive life choices • To prevent them from becoming adult perpetrators of Domestic Abuse Making Positive Choices addresses the issue of abusive behaviours at a young age. The project supports them to make positive life choices and avoid the negative experiences and consequences we see adult perpetrators dealing with as a result of their actions: relationship/family breakdown, losing access to their children, having a criminal record.

	Professionals working together greatly increases the chances of a positive outcome for those participating in the programme. Therefore, GPs, teachers, and others working with young people are encouraged to make referrals for those who would benefit from the Choices programme. All practitioners who deliver the Choices programme have undertaken Respect training, a programme developed to address the use of violence and abuse in children and young people's close relationships. The training is recognised by the Youth Justice Board Effective Practice Unit and is currently delivered across a number of Local Authorities and Police Crime Commissioner areas in England. Family Programme The Choices practitioners provide support, insight and simple solutions via weekly structured sessions and it takes about 3 months to complete. Sessions are varied and use a variety of tools and techniques. Some sessions are with the whole family, some with the parent and some with the young person. The programme reaches its full potential if both the young person and parent(s)/Carer(s) are involved Extended Programme (CYP only) Choices (extended programme) is a programme that aims to support 11-19 year olds who are at risk of perpetrating abuse or displaying controlling behaviour in their familial and/or intimate relationships. Support can be provided either individual or via group work – dependant on need. There is no charge to use this service and the Making Positive Choices programme is now available for referrals.

Description	As part of the Escape team, the CYPIDVA (Children & Young Peoples IDVA), provides higher risk children and young people aged 6 -17 with domestic abuse support. The CYPIDVA offers age-appropriate domestic abuse awareness and safety planning to incorporate the different risks posed to children and young people in today's multi-media society. The CYPIDVA works with young people aged between 6 -17 years who are experiencing serious harm from intimate partner violence and domestic abuse. They offer a trauma informed, needs led, risk assessed service, which is CYP centred, working proactively with other local agencies and professionals, to ensure that they receive integrated and seamless multiagency support. They provide advocacy, emotional and practical support and information to victims to address these needs as well as undertake safety planning with victims, developing an individual service/care plan to reduce the identified risks. The CYPIDVA also acts as a champion for children & young people by raising awareness of the adverse impact such abuse has on them.

Description	Advocacy and tailored support and information services to young survivors of domestic abuse and/or sexual exploitation aged 5-17 years of age who are experiencing significant harm from interpersonal harm and relationship abuse. Needs and risk assessments and refer high risk cases to MARAC /safeguarding where appropriate. Individualised Safety and Support Plans, working to reduce risk and meet identified needs including making referrals to other appropriate agencies. Provide an effective and well managed case work service working to targets agreed in the Safety and Support Plan and to act as an advocate for survivors keeping their safety at the centre of all coordinated responses. Conduct early intervention activities to reduce the occurrence of domestic and sexual violence in communities where it is prevalent and run outreach to groups at high risk, and increase awareness with children and young people who need access to independent support.

Description	CEASE Educational CEASE Educational is a 1 session program that is delivered in group settings. The session encourages active dialogue and participation, guiding young people to recognise abusive behaviour and understand what actions or support can keep them safe. • Can be done in person or online • The session is best delivered to groups of 15 people but can be adapted to bigger groups depending on the need • An assembly can be done but this would be a condensed and non-interactive session CEASE Mentoring For young people (Ages 13-24) who have witnessed, experienced or are experiencing Domestic Abuse. What the program consists of: • 1:1 weekly F2F or online sessions for up to 12 sessions • Emotional support • Education around Domestic Abuse and healthy/unhealthy relationship behaviours • Safety planning if appropriate Before making a referral to CEASE: • A DASH should be explained and completed with the young person if the abuse is still active, and they are willing to do this. • For anyone over the age of 16 they should be informed of the Domestic Abuse Service in their area and a referral made if they are willing to do this. Mentoring does not replace Domestic Abuse Services; these are still necessary, but we can work alongside them. • A referral to NCDV can be made if appropriate and the young person is willing to do this. • If the abuse is active a safety plan should be put in place with the young person while they are waiting for support to begin. • Social services or adult social care need to be contacted if the abuse is still active and...(a) There are children in the home (b) The young person is vulnerable i.e., physical disabilities or mental health issues or (c) The service is already involved. • Please find out if any other services are involved with the young person. Together Families • For any young person (Age 10-17) who is displaying controlling or coercive behaviours within their home. What the program consists of: • 12 sessions • F2F meetings with the whole family

	- F2F 1:1 sessions with each member of the family affected - Emotional support - Safety planning - Education around Domestic Abuse and healthy/unhealthy relationship behaviours - Education around managing emotions and behaviour Before making a referral to CEASE: - The young person displaying the controlling or coercive behaviours must be willing to participate and engage - At least one parent must be willing to participate and engage - Participating family members must be living in the same house - Always signpost parent(s) to PEGS - Signpost parent(s) to CAMHS if appropriate - Social services need to be contacted if...(a) The parent(s) feels they need this support (b) Other children within the home are being physically harmed by the young person's behaviours (c) The service is already involved. - Safety plan should be put in place with the parent(s) while they are waiting for support to begin - Please find out if there are any other services involved with the family/young person
