Name of Service / Project	Derbyshire Domestic Abuse Support Services – Adult Community Outreach Service									
Description	Community based support in the County Council area is commissioned to the Derbyshire Domestic Abuse Support Services consortium. Community based outreach support, delivered by a specialist domestic abuse support worker, is available to all adults (over 16) who are experiencing domestic abuse currently or are recovering/survivors of domestic abuse in the past. Consists of practical support (for example with housing, financial and legal issues etc) and emotional support (including physical and mental health issues). Support is delivered at home or in safe locations in the community. Access to therapeutic, self-esteem, confidence building, and healthy relationship programmes is delivered by the same providers (e.g. Freedom Programme, Voices Programme or similar group work). Referrals for the outreach service are via the Derbyshire Domestic Abuse Helpline or the Victim Care service. Self-referrals from the public (which come via phone, in person or by email) to any of the three organisations are also triaged, risk assessed and allocated.

Name of Service / Project	Stalking Advocacy Service
Description	Crossroads Derbyshire Stalking Advocacy Service offers specialist support to non-domestic related victims of stalking, across Derbyshire County (excluding Derby City – for this area please contact Glow IDVA service). The service accepts referrals directly from the police or Remedi (Derbyshire Victim Services), for non-DA, moderate / high risk cases. Support is available for anyone over the age of 16, both male and female. The service does not accept self-referrals at this time. Victims will be allocated an Independent Stalking Advocacy Specialist (ISAS) who will offer practical and emotional support and advocacy through the criminal justice system/process and ensure correct safety plans are in place to protect the victim.

	Support is predominantly offered remotely – via phone – except for face-to-face support at court and police stations. For any domestic related stalking cases, support can be offered to victims via the DA support provisions as provided by the Consortium. Professionals supporting such victims can liaise directly with the Stalking Advocacy Service for specialist stalking advice, and where necessary/appropriate, cases may be co-worked with an ISAS and a DA professional.

Our Family Support Service provides wrap-around family support including DV support and advocacy, court support, & Art psychotherapy through our Escape Team: - Safety Team Consisting of IDVA, ISVA & McKenzie - CYPIDVA (Children & Young Peoples IDVA) - Male Victim Worker - Outreach Support (targeted support for people with protected characteristics, including LGBTQ+, BME communities and people with disabilities, including mental health) The Escape team offers co-ordinated 1:1 Advocacy, Safety Planning, a Freedom Programme & Move On groups through Independent Domestic Violence Advisors (IDVAs), an Independent Sexual Violence Advisor (ISVA), CYPIDVA & Outreach work, to address the safety of victims at a higher risk of harm from intimate partners, ex-partners and/or family members.

	It also provides support to male victims of DV through its Male Victim Worker (from January 2022). The Escape Team serves as the victim's primary point of contact and will assess the level of risk to address the safety of the victim and their children. By working with victims, discussing the range of suitable options the team develops safety plans to address immediate safety, as well as supporting victims' longer-term solutions to meet their needs.

Located within Salcare's Family Support Service, our McKenzie friends are able to go into court hearings with victims and sit next to them at the front of the court, as a McKenzie friend cannot be excluded from a hearing without good reason. Victims are also able to show any papers to their McKenzie friend to discuss them. They can help victims get papers together and in the right order for hearings, help with documents they need to prepare or help with finding where they need to send documents. They can take also notes of what is said in court as an aide memoire for victims.

Description	WORTH (Women On the Road To Healing) was founded in 2014 by Robyn Riggans, a survivor of domestic abuse. Robyn discovered that although there are many charities supporting women to escape an abusive relationship, there is very little to help women on the healing journey and provide long term aftercare as they recover and rebuild their lives. WORTH has grown and developed out of Robyn's story and the stories of the women WORTH has supported through the years. Some of these women now volunteer with WORTH and are an integral part of the charity. Many domestic abuse survivors find themselves having lost friends after leaving the relationship and often suffer with anxiety and depression. WORTH offers a 1 -1 befriending service to help women develop new friendships and support networks. WORTH provides a safe space to share experiences, give and receive support, learn new skills, reduce isolation, build friendships and give women their voice back. It is a space where we can focus on the future and support our clients on their journey of healing post domestic abuse. WORTH offers a range of wellbeing groups which help rebuild confidence and self esteem and give women the tools they need to move on in life.
